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Exam Information



Exam Details

The Relativity Certified Administrator (RCA) exam is designed for individuals who are primarily responsible for administering their organizations' instances and workspaces, and understand the full suite of Relativity's end-to-end features and capabilities. They are seen as an advanced Relativity professional within their team or organization.

Prerequisites

RCA exam eligibility is based on the following prerequisites:

- Attended training in Relativity (either from Relativity, your own company, or on-the-job).
 - If Relativity training, we recommend attending Review Foundations, Admin Foundations I, and Admin Foundations II
 - Recommended experience: One year of industry experience and six months of instance and workspace management experience with Relativity.
- The number of study hours varies depending on how much experience you have with Relativity, as well as your job function. Most people spend about 40 hours studying for the RCA exam.

Exam Updates

The RCA exam is updated based on RelativityOne releases. New content may be added to the exam quarterly. Plan accordingly when attending trainings and studying.

Relativity Practice Environment

Registered RCA attendees automatically receive access to a version-specific environment within three business days of exam registration. **You have 12 weeks of usage time in the environment. This time begins immediately upon receiving access to the environment.**

You can also purchase a [2-week or 4-week extension](#) to the standard 12-week environment access. You are encouraged to purchase the extension before your access expires to preserve existing workspace data.

In this environment, you can create your own workspaces to practice the Practice Project using the provided Sample Data on the Community site. For more information on how to use the prep environment, please review the [RCA Prep Environment Access](#) document.



Exam Format

Exam Format

All aspects of Relativity case administration, including structured analytics, data transfer, and processing are covered on the exam. Conceptual analytics and Relativity Legal Hold are not on the exam.

You will receive **up to 80 items** during the exam, which includes a number of unscored items. We do not disclose which items are scored and unscored. Unscored items are used to introduce new exam items and provide Relativity performance statistics on the new content, which influences the future content of the exam. Unscored items are not included in the topic breakdown report you receive after completing your exam and do not impact your overall score.

You have **75 minutes** to complete the exam. During the exam, study materials and documentation are not permitted.

Exam Scoring

The RCA exam uses scaled scoring and requires a 700 or higher to pass. For more information on scaled scoring, please see the [Certification FAQs](#).

Subject matter experts develop, test, and participate in standard setting to determine the minimum level of knowledge required to achieve the RCA certification. Please read the [How is the RCA exam scored?](#) knowledge article for more details about exam scoring.

Exam Blueprint

All questions on the exam are weighted equally.

The following table outlines the various topics tested on the exam, along with their importance. The importance determines the number of questions you will receive in each topic. As the exam is updated, the percentage ranges may slightly change. There will be questions that test your ability to recall information as well as questions that require you to understand scenarios and apply your knowledge to determine the correct response.

You will be able to revisit questions and change your responses during the exam.

- **Each high importance topic covers 4-5% of the exam**
- **Each medium importance topic covers 2-3% of the exam**
- **Each low importance topic covers 1-2% of the exam**

Practice Project Instructions

The RCA Practice Project is designed to help you assess your understanding of Relativity and your preparedness for the exam. This exercise helps you study by assessing your ability to apply your knowledge of Relativity to a new series of requests. Use this resource to test your ability to analyze and adapt to new situations in Relativity - the more you rely on analysis, and the less you rely on muscle memory, the better you'll do on the exam.

Before completing the Practice Project, review the following instructions and tips for success.

Project Instructions:

1. Download the **RelativityOne Sample Data** for the RCA Exam Workbook and Practice Project from the Relativity Community. You will use this data on the Practice project.
 - A global data set is also available on the Community. The same resources are available in that set for you to use on the Practice Project exercise
2. Before you begin, **create a new workspace** in the prep environment. Use your assigned **Practice_Project** template.
 - When selecting a template for your new workspace, be sure to find and use the Practice_Project template workspace assigned to you. Your assigned workspace name will include your first name and the initial of your last name.
3. Complete all tasks in your newly-created **Practice Project workspace** in your environment.
4. After you complete the project, review the **Practice Project: Worksheet**. Use this worksheet to review your work, and think about your performance and areas of improvement.

Practice Project

Before You Begin:

- If you haven't already, download the RelativityOne Sample Data for the **RCA Exam Workbook and Practice Project** from the Relativity Community.
- Create a new workspace using your assigned **Practice_Project template** for this exercise.

Project Tasks:

- In the Practice Project workspace, load the **saltpepper.dat** using Import/Export. Map all load file fields and fix any errors.
- A member of your team, Shane Erver, is a member of the First Level Reviewers group and lets you know he is unable to complete his required tasks in the workspace. Update permissions for Shane's group based on the **PracticeProjectPermissions.txt** file in the **Practice Project Data and Resources** folder.
- To organize documents for review, use the **Default** Analytics profile to create and run an email threading structured analytics set for all documents in the workspace.
 - Create an email threading view to display your results.
- You just received a list of key terms in the matter. Run a report to find all documents containing the terms listed in the **PracticeProjectTerms.txt** file in the **Practice Project Data and Resources** folder.
 - Calculate unique hits, include family as a relational group, and ensure the results are saved to a field.
 - Ensure the saved search used as the searchable set cannot be accessed by **First Level Reviewers** in the workspace.
- Code all documents that contain the term **crude** as **Responsive** on the existing **Designation** field.
 - Create and run an imaging set of all Responsive documents sent in **October 2001**.
- Create a new dashboard named **Department Dashboard**.
 - Code documents and configure the new dashboard based on the requirements in the **PracticeProjectDashboard.txt** in the **Practice Project Data and Resources** folder.
 - Once configured, export the new dashboard to the desktop.
- The case team wants to see the production information for produced documents in the Viewer.
 - Create a view on the Production Information object that includes the following fields: Name, Production Type, Begin Bates, End Bates.
 - Share this new view on the **QC Layout**.
- Create and run a new production set that contains all documents coded **Responsive**, or any documents that contain any of the terms listed in the **PracticeProjectTerms.txt** file. Produce documents according to the specifications in the **PracticeProjectProduction.txt** file.



Practice Project Worksheet

After you complete the Practice Project, use this worksheet to check your work and analyze your performance in a meaningful way. Answer the following questions to review the steps you took to accomplish each task.

- In the Practice Project workspace, load the **saltvineapple.dat** using Import/Export. Map all load file fields, and fix any errors.
 - When loading this file, you encountered errors caused by incorrect configuration of the Author field and Date Created field in the workspace. You also encountered an error in line 5. Make sure you resolve these errors before you import data to ensure you correctly load all metadata fields from the load file.
 - While loading data, you may have noticed some load file field names (such as Email CC) did not match workspace field names exactly (such as CC). These fields do not Automap. You must map these fields manually in order to load the metadata.
 - From the Documents tab, check that you have **688** total documents. Click into a document to verify the document natives, extracted text, and all other metadata loaded correctly.
- Update permissions for Shane's group based on the **PracticeProjectPermissions.txt** file in the **Practice Project Data and Resources** folder.
 - To QC permissions, use the **Preview Security** feature for the **First Level Reviewers** group to ensure the group can accomplish all necessary tasks in the workspace.
 - For additional practice with permissions, use the **PracticePermissions.txt** file available in the **Project Sample Data** set.
- To organize documents for review, use the **Default** Analytics profile to create and run an email threading structured analytics set for all documents in the workspace.
 - Create an email threading view to display your results.
 - On the Practice Project, the **Default Analytics** profile and relational fields required for email threading are already created for you. What steps would you need to complete in order to run email threading if these objects were not already configured in your environment?
 - How did you configure your email threading view? What conditions, fields, and other settings did you select? How might you modify this view to include family documents?
- You just received a list of key terms in the matter. Run a report to find all documents containing the terms listed in the **PracticeProjectTerms.txt** file in the **Practice Project Exam Data and Resources** folder.
 - Calculate unique hits, include family as a relational group, and ensure the results are saved to a field.
 - Ensure the saved search used as the searchable set cannot be accessed by **First Level Reviewers** in the workspace.
 - If done correctly, your **Search Terms Report** will have **19** total hits, with **35** total hits including family.
 - What saved search did you use as a data source? How can you ensure you are only indexing the fields necessary?
 - How did you configure your dtSearch index? Think about any modifications you had to make to the noise words or alphabet file on the index, and any other types of modifications you may need to make on exam day.
 - What workspace settings did you have to modify to include family?
 - What does it mean to "ensure the results are saved to a field"? What other implications does this setting have?
 - How can you secure an individual folder from a specific group? How does this process change if you were to secure an individual field or view?

- The number of terms in the **PracticeProjectTerms.txt** file is representative of the number of search terms you can expect to see on the exam. For additional practice with search terms, use the **PracticeTerms.txt** file available in the Project Sample Data set.
- Code all documents that contain the term **crude** as **Responsive** on the existing **Designation** field.
- Create and run an imaging set of all Responsive documents sent in **October 2001**. Create and run an imaging set of all Responsive documents sent in **October 2001**.
 - To code these documents, you had to create a new choice on the **Designation** field. If done correctly, you will code 128 documents **Responsive**, and image 23 documents.
 - Because a specific imaging profile was not specified, you could use either the **Basic** or **Native** imaging profile. It's important to make sure your imaging set completed, and all documents were imaged. Consider what imaging errors or skipped documents might mean, and how you might resolve those issues should you encounter them.
- Create a new dashboard named **Department Dashboard**.
- Code documents and configure the new dashboard based on the requirements in the **PracticeProjectDashboard.txt** in the **Practice Project Data and Resources** folder.
 - Once configured, export the new dashboard to the desktop.
 - Consider when you would create a **Pivot Profile** as opposed to saving your current view as a dashboard.
 - If the field(s) you want to include are not available in the **Pivot** drop-down, how can you enable these fields to be used in a pivot?
- The case team wants to see the production information in the Viewer for the document you are viewing.
- Create a view on the **Production Information** object that includes the following fields: **Name**, **Production Type**, **Begin Bates**, **End Bates**.
 - Share this new view on the **QC Layout**.
 - How can you modify the **QC** layout to be able to access the linked **Production Information** without going to the **Production Sets** tab?
 - What are some other **Objects** to link to the layout that would make document review more efficient?
- Create and run a new production set that contains all documents coded **Responsive**, or any documents that contain any of the terms listed in the **PracticeProjectTerms.txt** file. Produce documents according to the specifications in the **PracticeProjectProduction.txt** file.
- How did you configure your production data source? If done correctly, the production includes 146 documents.
 - The type of requirements in the **PracticeProjectProduction.txt** file are representative of the type of requirements you can expect to see on the exam.
